

## **Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships**

**The Fullbore Events of the CSFC have been postponed from February to April 2010.**

**CRPF Range, Kardarpur, India. 15-24 April, 2010.**

This will be a new range, which is currently under construction. It will be a “no danger area” facility, with appropriately placed baffles. There will be a single firing point, in front of a spectator gallery, and movable electronic targets (from Sius Ascor).

### **Canadian Team Selection**

**300m Event.** A two-day trial was held during the 2009 Canadian Fullbore Championships. As a result, Stephen Maly, Nova Scotia, and Pierre Tremblay, Quebec, were invited to represent Canada. Unfortunately, due to the timing and to other commitments and issues, neither has been able to accept his place.

**Fullbore Event.** The three-year trial for CSFC selection was concluded at the 2009 Canadian Fullbore Championships. The three shooters are: James Paton, British Columbia, Des Vamplew, Ontario, and Paul Tremblay, Quebec. Sandy Peden, British Columbia, has been appointed as Coach/Manager of the Fullbore Team. Following the CSFC, two shooters will be named to represent Canada at the Commonwealth Games in October 2010. Also travelling to India will be Jim Thompson, who has been named as Chairman of the Jury for the Fullbore Event and as a member of the Jury for the 300m Event.

Subject to there being reasonable electronic communication from India, we hope to provide daily reports from Kardarpur in April.
